Lion Gerald Veale passed away suddenly on October 22 2022 in his 85th year. He will be sadly missed by family and friends.







RE: Fighting Childhood Cancer: Support the Best Possible Cancer Care

Gabby's family had no idea a nasty summer cold would turn their life upside down.

As her parents began to recover from the usual congestion and fatigue, Gabby did not.

She spiked a fever of 104 and was coughing through the night. The family rushed to Children's Hospital's Emergency Department thinking she had pneumonia.

Over time, by joining with other districts and the Lions Club International Foundation, you have generously supported Children's Hospital with gifts exceeding \$915,000.

Families like Gabby's need you.

While they manage the constant stress and fear of critical illness, our kids and their families need the Lions' to fund life-saving research that brings hope for better days!

We respectfully ask the Lions Clubs District A-1 for a new commitment to Children's Health Foundation for critically important research into oncology treatments at Children's Hospital, London Health Sciences Centre. Our Children's Hospital Cancer Care Program region and the District A-1 region, match, both serving communities from Windsor to London and all parts in Southwestern Ontario.

The experimental immunotherapy medication — Blinatumomab - replaced a whole block of Gabby's chemo, allowing her to go to school, socialize and continue living her life. Clinical research that needs donor support to continue.

The Children's trial made a world of difference. It gave Gabby a future and her family a future with her.

Today, Gabby is an active 13-year-old who celebrated five years of being cancer-free!

With the Lions' global cause of improving diagnostics, treatment, and continued care for kids with cancer, we believe the work of ground-breaking Children's Hospital clinicians and researchers like Dr. Zorzi – which you can see here: www.childhealth.ca/lionsA1 - are a perfect match for the Lions' goals.

Your generosity will lead to better solutions for kids like Gabby. Treatments that cause fewer moments of sickness and more moments outside of the hospital, feeling well, so kids can just be kids and hope for families like Gabby's

We know how powerful it can be when the Lions' band together in support of the Childhood Cancer Research Program, you will help ensure better treatments for our children. We know because donor-support helped make Gabby's clinical trial possible.

Today, Gabby's novel treatment is the first new standard of care for acute lymphoblastic leukemia and the first new paediatric cancer treatment available since the days of Terry Fox!






