Youth Exchange



After a successful camp last year, we are looking foreward to another successful camp in July 2024. Our plan is to bring in another 10 youth to our camp this year.

The youth will be 17-19 years of age and will arrive in Canada on June 27th, 2024 and this will be the start of the first host family session for 10 days. Change over for the youth to go to a different host family will occur on July 7th, 2024. Camp will interrupt the second host family stay as camp will start on July 16th, 2024 and end on July 25th, 2024 at which time the youth will return to the second host family until they return home on July 27th, 2024. This will allow the youth an opportunity for sleep and slower paced days prior to going to the Pearson airport.

In order to bring in 10 youth I need to have approximately 20 host families. I would like to see club participation in the youth that are staying within their area as well.

Is Hosting Right for Me?

Are you interested in learning about other cultures and ways of life while sharing your own customs and experiences?

Are open-mindedness, tolerance and cultural competence of high importance to you?

Do you have a desire to contribute towards peace, international understanding and the creation of global citizenship in youth?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, you may enjoy being a host family for the Lions Youth Camps and Exchange (YCE) Program!

Benefits of Hosting

Hosting an exchange youth is guaranteed to be a rewarding experience because:

You experience the joy of sharing your culture and daily customs

You learn about the exchange youth's customs and culture

You open a new world of possibilities and thinking to the exchange youth

You make a new friend - maybe a friend for life

Host Family Eligibility

The Host Lions Club must approve all host families. To be eligible to become a host family you must:

Be familiar with Lions clubs and the goals of YCE
Be able to provide a bed and meals for your guest
Follow all local laws related to youth protection
Police check for all persons over the age of 18 occupying the house
Pick-up and/or return youth to Toronto Airport if possible

If you are interested in more information please contact me and I would be more than happy to talk to you about hosting. We are also able to send youth from our communities on an exchange somewhere in the world. What should a youth expect in regards to their stay:

As a YCE exchange youth you can expect to be immersed in a unique cultural experience with Lions and Leo club members supporting your YCE journey. Your host family will treat you as a member of the family, expecting your engagement in typical daily routines and family meals. You will participate in social activities, possibly service projects and visit cultural places of interest. You are expected to familiarize yourself with the customs, expectations and basic language of the host country prior to your visit and have a desire to learn more.

If I have not yet been to your club to speak about Youth Exchange all you need to do is ask me and I will arrange a date to come to your club to speak and show you a short video on where the youth went during camp in 2023.

Only in the event the current first vice district governor does not stand for election as district governor, or if a vacancy in the position of first vice district governor exists at the time of the district convention, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of second vice district governor as set forth in the Lions Club International by-laws or constitution and who is currently serving or who has served one (1) additional year as a member of the district cabinet, shall fulfill the requirements of item 3 above.

A Candidate for the office of First Vice District Governor shall

- 1. Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
- 3. Currently be serving as the second vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected
- 4. Only in the event the current second vice district governor does not stand for election as first vice district governor, or if a vacancy in the position of second vice district governor exists at the time of the district convention, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of second vice district governor as set forth in the Lions Club International by-laws or constitution shall fulfill the requirements of item 3 above.

A Candidate for the office of Second Vice District Governor shall

- 1. Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
- 3. Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as second vice district governor:
 - a) As president of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the board of directors of a Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years; and
 - b) As zone chairperson or region chairperson or cabinet secretary and/or treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.
 - c) With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

A Candidate for the office of Region Chairperson shall

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions Club in good standing in his/her Region.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her Club or the majority of the Clubs in the Region.
- 3. Have served or will have served by the time he/she takes office as Region Chairperson:
 - a) As President of a Lions Club for a full term or major portion thereof and as a member of the Board of Directors of a Lions Club for no less than two (2) additional years; or
 - b) As Zone Chairperson of a District, or a Cabinet Secretary and/or Treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof;
 - c) With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

A Candidate for the office of Zone Chairperson shall

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions Club in good standing in his/her Zone.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her Club or the majority of the Clubs in the Zone.
- 3. Have served or will have served by the time he/she takes office:
 - a) As President of a Lions Club for a full term or major portion thereof and as a member of the Board of Directors of a Lions Club for no less than two (2) additional years:
 - b) With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

Your club delegate will cast a ballot for the following positions Governor, First Vice District Governor, Second Vice District Governor and if there are two candidates for Zone Chair within your zone, you will vote for one. Plus, location of the 2026 Convention. *If you are the delegate, please remember your signed membership card.*

More information will be forwarded to you regarding time that the credentials desk is open and when you may cast your ballot.

You embraced the Theme of "Together We Can" as we all found our footing after the Pandemic. Without your dedication and commitment to our Association this would not have been possible, so I will wear it proudly knowing that all of you played a part in my receiving this great honor.

E-Clubhouse Nook – How to Add Images

We are quite fortunate that when the Lions organization set out to provide a platform for local clubs to use that they developed one that is both robust and reasonably easy to use. I would like to share some of the processes that I am using in London Central's here to help make your online projects both easier to do and improve the final product. One important thing to recognize is that at least as of now we have no storage level restrictions so you have lots of room for uploads.

There are three ways to add information to the various pages. Firstly using direct text addition either by direct typing or from copying it from a text editor. Secondly it is possible to create a page from outside the system by saving it from a word processor in jpeg format. It can then be directly copied into the systems storage area and then assigned to the page you want to use it on. It is also possible to create links to pages for remote viewing from one host page. This allows you to share multiple documents on that page. To do this the documents have to be in PDF format and must be uploaded to your site. You would then assign links to them from the host page you want them to appear on.





Image Properties Sub Menu



The easiest thing to add is a picture so we will start there. After clicking your cursor into the page and assigning a position for it, click on the Image icon to start and the next menu starts the process. Shown to the right is the master image menu and from there it is possible to upload select and place an image into your webpage.

I have used this technique to place graphics on most of our sites pages. I especially like the image we use on our Lions Line access page. The link to it is below.



On Tuesday, December 19th, our club presented a donation to the Fight Like Mason Foundation. Here in the picture is Lions Mark Mahovlich, Club Treasurer, Joyce Mahovlich, Club Secretary, Zone 1 Chair Debbie Lemire and Iain Macri, Vice President Fight Like Mason Foundation.

The Fight Like Mason Foundation is a Registered Charity organization formed by Iain Macri and Chantelle Bacon, parents of Mason Bacon-Macri. Their son, Mason was diagnosed with Rhabdomyosarcoma (a form of childhood cancer) on May 4th, 2015 at the age of two. Mason fought this terrible disease head-on, like a Superhero, because he was a Superhero. Unfortunately, just after his 4th birthday Mason passed away.

Iain and Chantelle thought they would do Mason no greater honour than to carry on his name, his way of life and legacy in the form of a foundation. They decided to turn their life-shattering tragedy of losing a child into something positive. With their experience and compassion, they pledged to make a difference and give other children a chance to fight just like Mason did.

There are so many families that are shattered, broken and suffering from something that is of no choice of their own. This disease is in no way "rare" to any family going through it. Iain, Chantelle, the Fight Like Mason Board of Directors and volunteers will continue to do their part to honour Mason and provide research funding, medical equipment, support programs and valuable resources to help improve the lives of children and families who are currently fighting just like Mason did. They will continue their work until the villain is defeated for good.



Iain and Chantelle wanted to create something fun for any child going through cancer treatment. In the picture is Iain dressed as Spider Man and cancer patient Dominic beside one of the created IV poles dressed and designed in the child's favourite Super Hero. Iain and Chantelle also dress up as Super Heroes and visit children in children's wards throughout Ontario. The Foundation receives no government funding. The Foundation could not exist without support from clubs like ours. September is childhood cancer month and gold ribbons are placed throughout Belle River. Recently, boxes have been created to give to each child when diagnosed with cancer some support. The boxes include such items as a t-shirt, Polaroid camera, etc. These boxes have been distributed to children with cancer in the Province of Ontario which unfortunately is now 400 plus. Fight Like Mason Foundation has raised over 1.6 million over the past 6 years. The Foundation has now opened an office just behind Tim Horton's in Puce.
